

Cheat Sheet - 2021 Firearms Bills. There are 9 Firearm bills; 2 bills have mirror bills in the opposite chamber (we group these together in the list below). Published 3/7/21 – it is up to citizens to keep up to date on additional actions on any of these bills as they move through the legislative process.

Sponsored by: Representative(s) Wharff, Andrew, Baker, Bear, Burt, Fortner, Gray, Heiner, Jennings, Laursen, Neiman, Ottman, Rodriguez-Williams, Styvar and Winter and Senator(s) Biteman, Bouchard, French, James, McKeown and Salazar</p>	<p><i>Repealing gun free zones; providing for the carrying of concealed weapons as specified; clarifying that only the state legislature may regulate firearms, weapons and ammunition; amending a definition.</i></p> <p>WTC SUPPORTS. This bill is identical to HB0117 Repeal gun free zones and preemption amendments-3.</p> <p>Bill passed Senate Judiciary on 3/5 and now sits on General File.</p>
<p>HB0124 Second Amendment Preservation Act-2. Sponsored by: Representative(s) Laursen, Baker, Bear, Blackburn, Burt, Gray, Haroldson, Jennings, Neiman, Ottman, Styvar, Wharff and Winter and Senator(s) Biteman, Bouchard, French, Hutchings, James and Salazar</p>	<p><i>Relating to firearms; making legislative findings; invalidating certain federal laws that limit the right to bear arms; prohibiting enforcement of invalidated federal laws; imposing employment consequences for those enforcing invalidated federal laws; waiving sovereign immunity as specified; providing for severability.</i></p> <p>WTC SUPPORTS. We believe this bill is essential for the liberty and safety of all Wyoming residents now and in the future. This bill is identical to SF0081 Second Amendment Preservation Act, which has been waiting since Feb 4 to be heard in Senate Judiciary committee.</p> <p>This bill has been sitting in the House since 2/24 – MARCH 8 IS THE LAST DAY FOR HOUSE BILLS TO BE INTRODUCED.</p> <p>House Received for Introduction, 2/24.</p>

This bill is identical to HB0124 Second Amendment Preservation Act-2. This bill has been waiting since Feb 4 to be heard in Senate Judiciary committee. <p>HB0116 Concealed carry-residency requirement-2. Sponsored by: Representative(s) Wharff, Andrew, Baker, Bear, Burt, Fortner, Gray, Heiner, Jennings, Laursen, Neiman, Ottman, Rodriguez-Williams, Styvar and Winter and Senator(s) Biteman, Bouchard, French, Hutchings, James, McKeown and Salazar</p>	<p>Removing the state residency requirement for a person carrying a concealed firearm without a permit who meets the other statutory criteria.</p> <p>This bill applies to any U.S. resident. This is apparently to create reciprocity with other states. We absolutely support reciprocity with other educated and responsible gun-owners from other states. Having said that, we also consider the potential unintended consequence of giving that blessing to radical leftists who might want to conceal carry in WY - and it gives us pause. If this bill didn't pass, out-of-staters would still be able to open-carry. Perhaps the hearing & debates of this bill will educate us more and change our mind...</p> <p>This bill is on House Judiciary schedule for MONDAY MARCH 8 AT 8am.</p>
<p>HB0214 Firearms in private vehicles. Sponsored by: Representative(s) Wharff and Laursen and Senator(s) Bouchard and Driskill</p>	<p>Allowing firearms to be stored in a motor vehicle located in an employer's motor vehicle parking area; providing exemptions and immunity.</p> <p>WTC SUPPORTS.</p> <p>MARCH 8 IS THE LAST DAY FOR HOUSE BILLS TO BE INTRODUCED. House Received for Introduction, 3/4.</p>
<p>HB0236 Firearms transactions-financial discrimination. Sponsored by: Representative(s) Washut, Burkhart, Jennings, Laursen and Wharff and Senator(s) Hutchings and Landen</p>	<p>Prohibiting financial institutions from discriminating against firearms businesses; specifying civil remedies; providing for attorneys fees and costs for a successful action; providing a statute of limitations on civil actions; providing for potential loss of state business to a financial institution found to have violated this act.</p> <p>WTC SUPPORTS.</p> <p>Introduced and Referred to House Judiciary, 3/5.</p>
<p>SF0137 Firearms preemption-amendments and applicability. Sponsored by: Senator(s) Kinskey and Biteman and Representative(s) Jennings</p>	<p>Precluding the University of Wyoming and Wyoming community colleges from regulating firearms as specified; defining terms; clarifying the applicability of the preemption of firearms regulation by the state as specified.</p> <p>WTC SUPPORTS.</p> <p>Introduced and Referred to Senate Judiciary, 3/2.</p>
<p>SF0155 Limiting firearm seizure and regulation during emergencies. Sponsored by: Senator(s) Driskill, Biteman, Bouchard and Salazar</p>	<p>Specifying additional limitations on the exercise of powers related to homeland security and states of emergency concerning firearms.</p> <p>WTC SUPPORTS. Bill passed Senate Judiciary unanimously on 3/5 and now sits on General File.</p>

- Always check the **'Amendments'** tab on any bill you're tracking to see if changes have been made to the bill language. Adjust your arguments if necessary in any communications with legislators.
- If a bill crosses over to the next chamber with amendments, be sure to read and refer to the updated **Engrossed Version**.
